

Payroll

On Monday, Heidi Lahey from the WREA Task Force for MTRS and myself met with Ken Mills, Chair of the Business Finance Subcommittee to give him some background information about the continual payroll problems. The subcommittee had the item on the agenda for tonight's meeting. I reached out to other union presidents and several of us attended. Many of the payroll issues we have been experiencing were discussed and are now public record. At this point the solution is not clear, the subcommittee discussed

whether a review of office processes or an audit needed to be conducted, and charged Dan Deedy with preparing options for the subcommittee to look at.

MTA Annual Meeting - updated info

The MTA Annual Meeting will be held on Friday, May 20, 2022 and Saturday, May 21, 2022. We have twelve seats for delegates. Three members have volunteered, thank you Stacey Duffy, Jochen Welsch, and Joe Jourdain. There will be three options for attendance: in person with masking and vaccination required, additional in person spaces will be available with at least three feet between seats, and a virtual option is also being offered.
